Dear Siblings in Christ,

Summer greetings to you all! Last Sunday we received the gift of watching the video that Joel prepared to share with the congregation as we bring his ministry to closure. You can find that video <a href="HERE">HERE</a>. There were tears shed in the congregation as we watched. Grief is like that. It rises up in waves and flows down our cheeks, sometimes when we aren't anticipating it. ("I thought I was done grieving!") And now as I write, the last video greetings and cards for Joel are coming in.

THANK YOU to all of you who have taken this grief and closure process to heart. Your willingness to do so will serve you and the congregation well as we move through the transition process into the future that you will create together! And because of your willingness, and Joel's willingness as well, you can begin to shape a new relationship with Joel and family as NEIGHBORS!

As you may recall, a while ago I shared a very simple framework about transitions articulated by William Bridges. His framework is simply that in any transition there are three parts: The Ending. The Neutral Zone. And The New Beginning.

Every one of those three stages is necessary and important, and healthy transition can't happen without any of them! So bravo to all of you...we have just completed the first stage! The Ending! Now we can move freely and confidently into the next critical stage of the transition process: "The Neutral Zone."

Despite its laughably uninspiring title, a LOT happens in The Neutral Zone. The Neutral Zone is kind of like "winter" in the cycle of the seasons. Or it's kind of like the time we spend sleeping. It doesn't LOOK like anything is happening, but SO MUCH is happening! We and the earth are processing, regenerating, replenishing, and dreaming!

So, we are officially entering The Neutral Zone. Does this Zone last until the new pastor is called? Or just until you officially start the call process? I think there's probably a gray area there, but most certainly right now through mid-September we are in The Neutral Zone. What does that mean? What will be happening?

**First and foremost**, I really invite you to rest. To allow yourself to recognize the journey you have been through to this point and savor it. Get together with one another just for fun. Allow yourself to slow down and, literally, stop and smell the roses. Treasure the gift of this community. Your "resting" makes space for the Spirit to do the work in and through you in ways you can't even imagine.

**Second,** there will be a special gathering each month for the next three months. Thank you, Vision Team, for your awesome leadership with these! There are more details elsewhere in The Herald, but please mark these dates and plan to participate:

- Sunday, July 20: Coffee and Conversation with me to ask all the questions you have about the transition process (whether I can answer them or not!)
- Sunday, August 24: Salsa Sunday! With a Visioning activity to encourage your dreams for the future!
- Sunday, September 21: Celebration Sunday! Kick Off of the Transition process, invite Stewardship, and Welcome New Members

**And third,** you'll notice in the liturgy the language from the prophet Joel about our youth seeing visions and our elders dreaming dreams. As we move into August, **I'll be inviting you to write down some of those visions and dreams** for the congregation, neighborhood, and community. Just as we wrote down our prayers of grief, and then gratitude, now we write down our visions and dreams and offer them up to God as well!

As William Bridges reminds us, especially in The Neutral Zone, "Creativity is Key!" So allow yourself to daydream, imagine, wonder, ponder... All this will prepare your hearts and the congregation for the new beginning that is to come.

Blessings in The Neutral Zone!

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### **Oregon Synod Assembly Update**

From May 31-June 2, the Oregon Synod Assembly of the ELCA (Evangelical Lutheran Church in America) met. The "Oregon Synod" refers to the organization of ELCA churches in Oregon. The Oregon Synod is one of 65 synods of the ELCA. Thanks to our delegates this year: Pastor Solveig, Sally Ritchie, and Meredith Gifford for participating as voting members in the Assembly! Thanks also to Roger Fuchs who participated and to Deacon Laura Gifford for serving as the chair of the Bishop's Election Taskforce.

Every year, delegates from each ELCA congregation in Oregon gather to do the "business" of the church. What is that "business?" Standard things like adopting a budget, and hearing reports from various ministries. It also includes electing officers and members of the Synod Council, as well as discussing "Resolutions." These Resolutions are statements or recommendations about topics of concern brought by active ELCA members or congregations throughout the synod. The Assembly discusses each resolution and votes on whether to affirm it or not. (Note, "Memorials" are also brought for discussion. The difference between a Resolution and a Memorial is that a Resolution is directed only toward the Synod. A Memorial is a statement or a recommendation directed toward the entire ELCA. Memorials that pass are then sent on to the ELCA to be considered when delegates from all 65 synods gather for the "ELCA Churchwide Assembly" that happens every three years.)

This year we also had a Bishop's election. Bishops serve six-year terms. Bishop Laurie Larson Caesar was elected in 2019 and stood for reelection during this assembly. She was elected handily on the third ballot. Congratulations, Bishop Laurie!

Below are the Resolutions and Memorials that were discussed and voted on, as well as the recipients of offerings received at the Assembly.

### **Assembly Offerings**

Thanks to your generosity, the assembly offerings raised:

- **\$6,525.91 for the** Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land. This offering will go to the schools of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land where life has been disrupted for many months by horrific violence. The Lutheran Church there has worked to keep the Lutheran schools open to families to offer some regularity and activity in a traumatizing time.
- **\$4,229.55 for the** <u>Flooding Recovery on the Burns Paiute Reservation</u>. In April, the Burns Paiute Tribe Reservation near Burns, OR (home of the ELCA congregation Church of the Living Waters) suffered destructive flooding. Disaster relief for this tribe of about 200 members is caught up in the federal funding chaos and it is unclear if/when any will arrive.
