Dear Friends,

The signs of the changing of the seasons are everywhere: my windshield was covered with a gorgeous array of multi-colored leaves this morning! There are more rainy and cloudy days than there are sunny days. Fall decorations are everywhere! Pumpkins on front porches, Halloween skeletons in yards, oranges and browns and yellows and reds cover the ground and mantles and kitchen tables. And in just a few days we will step into the sacred space and time of honoring the ancestors and saints on All Saints Day. The seasons are changing!

And as if on cue, this community is also changing! Last Sunday we bid a tender farewell to Todd Marston, our beloved Minister of Music for nearly a decade. And this Sunday we welcome Paul Paresa, our new and already beloved Minister of Music! And what a gift Todd and Paul are giving us — they are present, real life reminders that change inevitably brings grief, but it also brings new possibilities and new life! Thank you, Todd and Paul, for embodying this truth for us!

The seasons are changing! And as it relates to the call process, I want to let you know that your church council is faithfully, prayerfully and thoughtfully stewarding that change right now.

The council received over 30 nominations for the Call Committee! Of those 30, 18 accepted their nominations and said that, if chosen, they would be willing to serve on the Call Committee. Wow! Just so you know, serving on the Call Committee is truly stepping into a journey into the unknown! It requires trust, prayer, LOTS of time, discernment, excellent communication skills, good will, and the ability to listen deeply to others and speak from your heart. So THANK YOU to the 18 who said YES to setting out on that journey, if selected.

And if you said YES but aren't ultimately selected, please know that your council is considering and discerning MANY, many factors in the selection of the Call Committee, far beyond the gifts that each individual brings. So know that your willingness to serve has given the council many good options to choose from, and it has meant that they have to do deep discernment, because every one of you would bring unique gifts. So thank you for saying YES to being considered.

And I also want to thank each of you who said NO to serving on the Call Committee. I hope you also have taken in the honor of being nominated. I know that in church culture it's often difficult to say no. We can often fall into *scarcity* mode: I NEED TO do this because no one else will. Or *obligation* mode: I SHOULD do this because someone asked me. But that's not how God's call works. God's call works in *GRACE MODE*. Grace mode frees us to honor our limits and listen to our hearts, even and especially when our hearts say "no," because we

know that God's grace is moving in us as a community, and grace will find and empower those who can joyfully say "yes!"

So...again, a huge thank you to the council and to all who submitted nominations, to all who said no, to all who said yes, and to all who will ultimately serve on the Call Committee, or be selected as alternates.

Once the Call Committee is selected, the committee will meet and select its chair or co-chairs, and then get to work!

Now...this next piece is really important, so please hear this and remind one another about this, if anyone starts getting anxious about the pace of the process. It will be several months before the committee will be engaging with any potential candidates. There is a *lot* of preparatory work the committee needs to do before even receiving the paperwork from any potential candidate. They have to meet and select their chair or co-chairs. We have to commission them publicly; they have to come to fully understand the process they're in; they have to take the time to build relationships of trust with one another; and they have to figure out what rhythm of meeting works best for that particular group of people. And with the holidays arriving, it's very possible that the process may take even a little longer than it might normally take.

So, my invitation to the congregation is to *relax*. Take a deep breath. Trust God's timing. Trust the Call Committee. Don't waste your time asking them questions or pressuring them to move faster. Instead, take the time to thank them regularly for doing their work on behalf of the congregation.

In fact, by some delightful coincidence, thanks to the Holy Spirit, the theme for the Advent season coming up is *Surrendering to the Darkness*. I invite you to get a jump on that surrendering theme by starting now as it relates to the call process. Surrender any anxiety that may arise in you, or any need to know or control the outcome. It's in God's hands and you will have a faithful, dedicated, and competent Call Committee guiding the congregation through the process.

The seasons are changing! I invite you to surrender into the changes and the grace that makes those changes possible. Thanks be to God!
